

Wow - what a wonderfully busy term for Reception with a real learning buzz in the classroom. We found out about different festivals

around the World - we learned about how people celebrate Day of The Dead, Diwali, Hanukkah and Christmas around the World. We also recycled and made our paper which we turned into decorations not to mention learned lots of songs and lines for our wonderful Nativity. Well done Reception for working so incredibly hard this half term - enjoy a well earned holiday!

We started this half term in **Shade Nursery** with Halloween! We made all sorts of magic potions! From fizzing and bubbles to dancing raisins, we've been casting spells and making our own magic! We also explored everything

pumpkin. Investigating, scooping, rolling, tasting roasted pumpkin and making pumpkin soup! After that was bonfire night! We discussed the sounds, colours and shapes they make and explored lots of different ways of colour mixing and mark making to make pictures of our own fireworks. Following that we began to look at the cold weather, reading 'A Perfect Day' story book, and using hats, gloves and scarves in our imaginative play, developing our independent dressing skills. Then onto Christmas with our Nativity, Christmas dinner

and Christmas party (with a very special visitor - Father Christmas!) and all sorts of festive activities inbetween, like baking gingerbread men and mince pies!



Reflections from KS1

Year 2 have had a very busy half term. It all started with our trip to Eureka which was excellent. In English we have been learning all about ways to save our world. We wrote some letters to Eureka and a set of instructions for making bird feeders. In maths we have completed our addition and subtraction unit and have moved on to looking at shape. In Geography we have been learning all about Todmorden and where we live.



Our first learning log was a complete success and Mrs Fogg was very impressed with the high standard of work and of course we cannot forget the amazing performance that Year 2 gave in our Christmas Production. Year One have had an incredibly busy half term! We have been reading the wonderful book 'Look Up' in English and writing our very own instructions for space rockets using time adverbials and bossy verbs. In Maths, we have looked at addition and subtraction, solving lots of missing number problems along the way. We are now much more confident in using the partwhole model. In Science we have had fun exploring carnivore and herbivore teeth and have found out all about our school and local area in our Geography topic. We've been on a walk and created a floorplan of our school!

Reflections from KS2

Year 6 have had a very busy half term! They have become BODMAS masters in Maths whilst beginning their study of fractions. We have learnt how to use the four operations with fractions and grown in confidence each day. In English, the children are thoroughly enjoying our class book 'Wonder' which explores the life of August Pullman who lives with Treacher Collins Syndrome. The children have learnt



about August's condition and have written a wide range of text types linking to the story itself. The main message

we have learnt from that book is to be kind, always. In History, we have come towards the end of our WW2 topic which was rounded off nicely with our trip to Danelaw where the children experienced life during the war. It was so lovely to see all our Year 6 children supporting Children in Need this year and dressing up in yellow and spots for the occasion. We also held the whole school 'Design a Pudsey' competition which was very well supported. It has been great to see Y6 get into the festive spirit this year as we have taken a key role in the KS2 nativity, many of the children auditioning for solos and narrations. Coming Up

Nursery will be welcoming some new children in January and looking at fairy tales.

Reception topic next half term will be Winter, and Houses and Homes. We will be looking at different kinds of buildings in and around our local area as well as the rest of the World. We will also be watching for wintery weather changes - hopefully we will get some snow!

Year 1 will continue to look at addition and subtraction next half-term, developing our knowledge to numbers within 20. In English, we will be starting our fairy tale unit which will lead us to cooking up some tasty concoctions. We have worked hard on mastering our simple sentences and will soon be introducing exclamation marks to the mix! Geography will see us looking at our island home, whilst Science will have us exploring materials.

Year 2 will be reading Wild by Emily Hughes and experimenting with our creative writing. In Maths, we will finish off our shape topic before moving on to money. Our history topic in the New Year will be the Great Fire of London. Keep a look out for another learning log project.

Year 3 are looking forward to the book Arthur and the Golden Rope. In Maths we will be working on Multiplication, Division again, Money and Statistics. In science the topic is Forces and Magnets and in Geography we will be looking at our European neighbours

Year 4 will move onto multiplication and division, fractions and decimals in Maths. We will be reading "The Miraculous Journey of Edward Tulane" as the basis for our English work and our Science topic will be Electricity. We will also be delving into the Ancient Egyptian world in History.

Year 5 will be continuing to improve our understanding of multiplication, division and fractions in Maths and in English, moving onto our new class book, Shackleton's Journey. We will also be starting a subject not yet covered in Year 5, geography.

Year 6 are going to move on to study decimals and percentages in Maths whilst continuing to read Wonder in English. Our topic is going to be North America where we will learn about the human and physical characteristics of a state in America and compare these to other countries as well as the North West studied.
